Outline

Tokugawa leyasu gained power with the victory in the Battle of Sekigahara, and in order to keep this power, the first thing he worked on was the maintenance of the "Tokaido Road" that connects his castle in Edo with Kyoto/Osaka. Each post-town was enacted by leyasu and as the roads developed, travelers increased, which resulted in a travel boom in the late Edo era. During the travel boom, the "Fifty-Three Stations of the Tokaido" Ukiyo-e series including Utagawa Hiroshige's "Fifty-Three Stations of the Tokaido" (Hoeido Edition) was born.

This exhibition will introduce leyasu's footsteps that remain in the "Tokaido Road" with particular focus on the series pieces of Hiroshige's "Fifty-three Stations of the Tokaido".


ACCESS

leyasu and Tokaido ~How It was Depicted by Hiroshige~

In the New Years of 1601, Tokugawa leyasu set post towns as the top priority of "Go-kaido Road maintenance" and established the transportation system, which led to the beginning of modern-day "Tokaido." As maintenance of the roads progressed, and circumstances for travel improved, a travel boom amongst common people emerged in the late Edo era and long sellers with Tokaido as the theme such as Hiroshige's Ukiyo-e, "Fifty-Three Stations of the Tokaido" (Hoeido Edition) was published. The "Tokaido" became one of Hiroshige's signature concepts and it is said that he created more than 20 varieties of the "Fifty-three Stations of the Tokaido" series during his lifetime.

This exhibition will pick up Gyosho Tokaido and Reisho Tokaido from Hiroshige's "Fifty-three Stations of the Tokaido" and exhibit all pieces from Nihonbashi to Kyoto in separate sessions. How did Hiroshige depict the Tokaido which was maintained and greatly developed by leyasu? Let's look at scenes of the Tokaido by Hiroshige, along with stories of leyasu that continue to be told in the post-towns of each region.

Part1: Fifty-three Stations of Tokaido (Gyosho Tokaido) 55 pieces

Published during 1841 and 1843 - this is a series of work called "Gyosho Tokaido" as the title is written in semi-cursive script (Gyosho script).
