Outline

One of the major aspects that drove cultural and economic development in the Edo era were development of traffic networks such as transportation on the roads beginning with the *Go-Kaido Road* (the five major roads starting from Edo) maintained in the Edo era, as well as water transportation of boats carrying cargo over rivers, lakes, and oceans. Enjoy the various "Paths" designed to connect people and things depicted in Ukiyo-e by *Eshi* (painter) including Hiroshige approximately 200 years after the Edo Shogunate was established. The second exhibition will present "Hiroshige Museum of Art: Fresh Releases!" featuring works that have rarely been displayed including "Grain production through the four seasons" that has not been displayed for nearly 10 years and other Ukiyo-e pieces of the Meiji era in forms such as *Byobu* (folding screen) and *Kakejiku* (hanging scroll).

The Path: Connecting People and Things

"Paths" are one of the elements that are necessary in the development and exchanges of society, economy, life, and culture since ancient times. Tokugawa leyasu also prioritized rule over "paths" and he began maintenance of roads by establishing post towns on the Tokaido connecting Edo with Kyoto/Osaka in 1601, which was a year after the battle of Sekigahara. leyasu also put a lot of effort in maintenance and revolutionizing the road system by setting Nihonbashi as the starting point of the five major roads in 1604. The Edo Shogunate did not only improve transport on land as they also worked on maintenance of waterways, which allowed boats to transport large amounts of goods on rivers, lakes, and oceans. With a stable government ruling all of Japan in the Edo era, many people and things traveled various "paths" leading to a large boost in economy and the birth of many new cultures.

This exhibition will introduce the various "paths" depicted by *Eshi* (painter) that have connected people and things in Ukiyo-e. Please enjoy the "paths" that have developed over maintenance, and the sight of people traveling on them in the late Edo era, which is nearly 200 years after the Edo Shogunate was founded.
